Forty Towers!

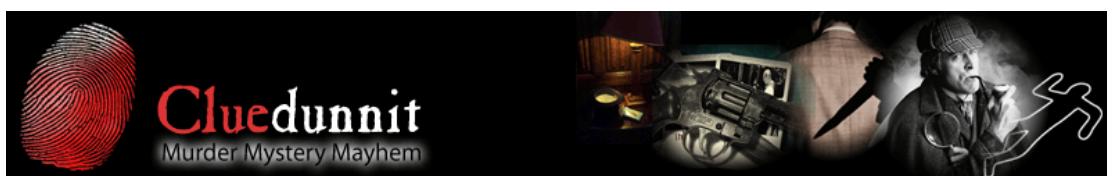
The staff and resident guests are celebrating the hotels' 25th Anniversary.

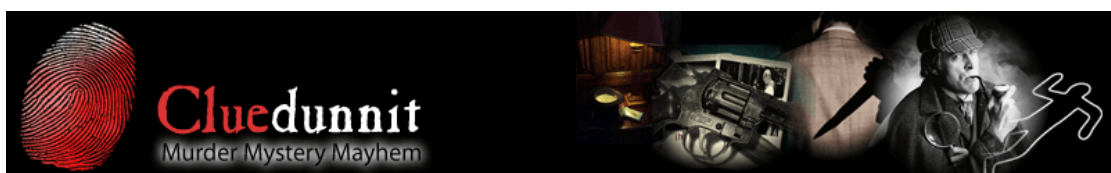
Return...to Murder

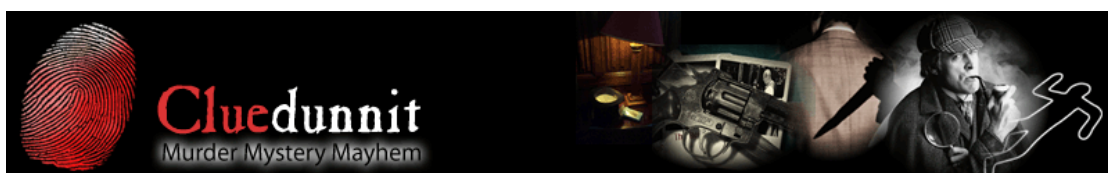
Shepherdham Studios also have Walter Wilde and Shirley Pratt who are both nominated for Best Actor – and they are both keen to carry home the gong.

The School Reunion

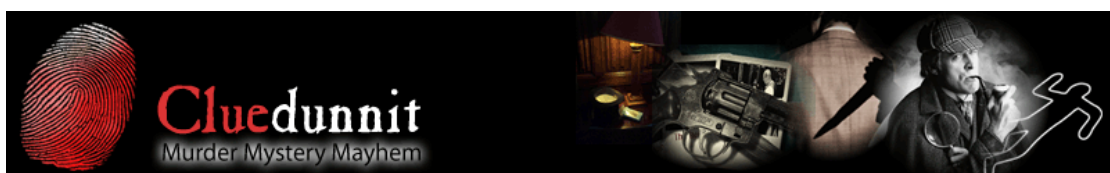

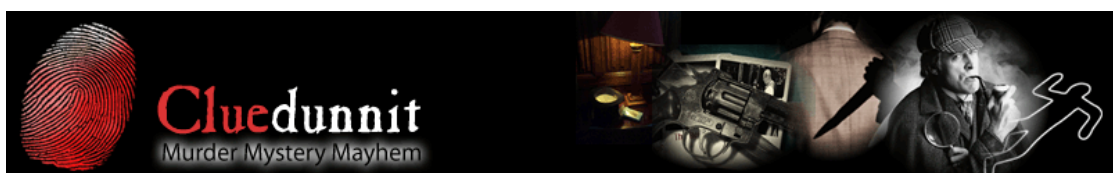
The guests at this wedding are anything but ordinary and the outcome of the day will be so disastrous, even a thunderstorm in comparison would have seemed like a good option.

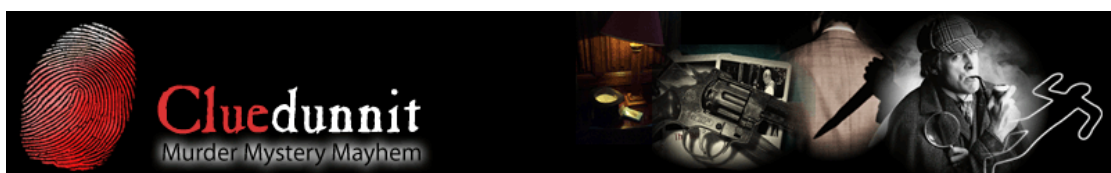
When a village gets together to make a collective decision it is not unusual to encounter a little animosity or even in extreme circumstances perhaps a good deal of shouting.
